

### Val raises the standard for P&O

Val Baldwin has been in the security industry for some 20 years. Silhouette profiles the Security Excellence Awards nominee, dipping into her citation to find out more about her approach and what makes her among the best in the industry.

Profile's Contract Manager at the P&O port facility in Kingston-upon-Hull demonstrates a rare mix of skills. Fielding phone calls from Humberside Police, stopping to speak to her Security Officers and P&O staffers on her rounds, her passion and commitment are immediately obvious. Around her is a close-knit team, inspired by her infectious enthusiasm and ready to go the extra mile. The results are tangible.

### Northern Star

Despite the pressures of a port-based job where shipping timetables can change at a moment's notice, where unexpected arrivals and delays can lead to increased security alerts, Val relies on a dedicated team that can be called up at a moment's notice.

Her own flexible, hands-on presence has not gone unnoticed. The ferry company are full of praise: "Val has the full respect and support of her staff. She leads by example where more experienced staff are concerned, and nurtures the new starters, always looking to encourage and support them".

provide guidance on how to detect suspicious activity, identity theft, money laundering, counterfeiting and asset stripping".

It's all part of a rigorous programme of measures designed so clients can put in place contingency plans and policies to prevent and combat corruption and fraud – be it internal or external.

Even before problems develop, Farleigh can assist with vetting individuals (at any level) prior to employment. At a corporate level, in the case of proposed takeovers and mergers, Farleigh's

### Embracing technology

They go on to say, "With so many people averse to change, Val's willingness to accept new technology is refreshing". As well as her team's routine use of CCTV, metal detectors for screening passengers, x-ray machines for checking luggage and the addition of explosive detection machines, Val has introduced a host of innovative measures, some of them quite surprising.

Mountain Bike Patrols – Val noticed how her mobile patrols were getting caught up in traffic and other restrictions around the port. She arranged for some of the patrol cars to be replaced with mountain bikes. Since their introduction, Officers have been able to cover a wider area and increase their productivity.

Beam Intruder Systems – Working in partnership with the Police, Val identified a problem with car crime in the P&O Ferries car park. After completing a full security survey, Val's suggestion of an infra-red beam intruder system helped cut the crime rate.

Over-C – Val also manages the Over-C system which is used by her team on a day-to-day basis. There to improve Officer safety and productivity, the Over-C Near Field Communication (NFC) system generates reports, distributing tasks, information and Assignment Instructions to her Officers.

Val also plays an integral role in the port's wider security team, working in close partnership with many organisations to ensure the overall port facility is kept secure, in line with the UK's National Security Strategy.

### Be the best

Humberside Police's Crime Reduction Officer commented: "The availability of Profile staff is of paramount importance to the Police when adopting a partnership approach to solving a problem. Security operations which Val has organised have led to a significant amount of arrests and recovered property".

The Excellence Awards citation concluded, "Val is an inspirational leader. She recognises the benefits a high performing team can bring and strives to ensure her people are motivated, recognised, developed and provided with opportunities to progress. As a result, people want to work for her and most importantly, they want to be the best they can be".

## Title race is on!

Profile is among the nominees for the 2009 Security Guarding Company of the Year Award. Silhouette looks at some of the reasons highlighted in our bid to clinch one of the industry's biggest prizes.

Criteria set out for the category are summarized as follows: "This Award will be presented to a security guarding company that has demonstrated professionalism, consistency of service and responsibility to both customers and staff".

### A winning difference

Highlighted in Profile's citation is its enviable reputation across a wide range of industry sectors for providing reliability, flexibility, innovation and excellent staff retention levels. The latter is an area that will come under particular scrutiny by the judges. Profile's stats stack up: our employee turnover is among the lowest in the industry with a "churn" of less than 25%. This is significantly below industry average which is estimated to be above the 40% mark.

Other significant points of difference we were keen to highlight to the judges included our focus on personal service and solutions that are tailored around the individual needs of our clients.

Profile took the strategic decision not

to diversify into too many areas to ensure that the standards of its core services remain high.

Key evidence for this lies in the company's unusually low clients-to-manager ratios. Each of our Customer Service Managers is responsible for no more than 12 contracts. This is almost two-thirds lower than the industry average. As a result our managers are able to spend much more time on site, allowing them to gain a fuller understanding of each client's business and culture.

#### Dedicated to our teams

Also highlighted in our pitch to the judges was our commitment to staff training and development, our dedicated Training Director, and an ethos that encourages a long-term, career focussed approach. Part of this is our skills pledge: currently under development in partnership with the Learning and Skills Council, the pledge promises to ensure that 100% of our staff are qualified with an NVQ (Level 2) in Providing Security Services and the BTEC (Level 2) Diploma for Security Practitioners by the end of 2009.

Finally, we also highlighted our heavy investment in management training – all our bosses are enrolled on our management development programme through which they will achieve an industry recognised qualification and learn more about effective account management.

They, along with all members of the Profile team, will be waiting with bated breath to see how they fare against some stiff competition on the night of the 2009 Service Excellence Awards – Thursday October 22nd.

# Narrow escape for telecoms firm

A vigilant security guard and some quick thinking helped to avert disaster, reports London Regional Manager, John Cooper.

COLT, a leading provider of business communications, operates a number of major data centres across Europe. Its London base outside the M25 is one of its largest. On Sunday 7th June, Profile Security Guard Meshwin Vigneswaran was making regular patrols as part of his O700-1900 shift at the King John Court facility.

### Thunder

Meshwin discovered a water leak coming through the roof during a particularly heavy thunderstorm. Had it not been for his swift intervention, the flow of water could easily have led to a serious incident, with the company's Nortel Switch equipment in the Node at King John Court being disabled. Had this happened, COLT's services would have been seriously disrupted.

Following agreed emergency procedures, Meshwin called up COLT's DCIS incident team, the duty Mobile Manager, and informed their Security Control Team at Powergate at the same time. With the appropriate response teams mobilized, Meshwin then took care to stem the leak, rounding up containers to catch the water and minimize its effects.

#### Under control

With the situation under control, he went on to search the rest of the building for further damage, checking back to the site of the incident until engineers reached the scene. As a result of his actions, roof drain maintenance to the site is now to be checked quarterly rather than just every six months. Meantime, Meshwin has been named June's Guard of the Month for the London Region and earned the plaudits of a very grateful team at COLT.

# Yacht raid provides clue to money laundering scam

Suspicious comings and goings, people stepping on and off a yacht in Ramsgate Marina on Friday 10th July all drew Security Officer Ian Usher's attention enough to call in support from the Police.

### Suspicious

As Police Officers arrived at the scene, the owner of the "Sea Dawn" made off. Subsequent investigations quickly revealed that the man was wanted for failing to appear in court and had recently acquired the vessel for a large sum of money, paid in cash.

### Praise

The vessel was seized as evidence of an alleged money laundering offence with the owner later handing himself in to Police. Detective Chief Inspector Matt Pringle, Deputy Head of Frontier Operations, Kent Police was warm in his praise of lan's prompt actions: "This is yet another excellent example of the first class joint working relationship that we enjoy with you (the Harbour Master - Ed) and your team".

Surprised by all the attention, lan assured his line manager, "I was just doing my job". His vigilance earned him a £100 cheque and July's Guard of the Month title for the region.




