## ADRIAN'S HIDDEN TALENT

#### **Intricate**

The first part of the process was to remove all the layers of old varnish. So many coats had been applied over the years that some of the lettering was nearly obliterated and it was even difficult to identify what type of wood the sign was actually made of.

Adrian then hand-sanded the whole board and used a special tool to recarve all of the intricate lettering. A delicate and time-consuming process, he had to avoid going too deep as this would have irrevocably damaged the wood. Next, the board was treated with five layers of beeswax – each one applied by hand – before restoring the Leicester City Police crest.

#### Craftsmanship

With the colour match needing to be exact, Adrian mixed all of the paint himself. After some painstaking craftsmanship, seven days on, Adrian's masterpiece was complete.

Chief Constable **Simon Cole** was suitably impressed: "I can't thank Adrian enough for completing this restoration project so brilliantly

and so quickly. He's done a truly wonderful job. It is important for us to remember that these officers gave up their lives and this restoration project is an opportunity to demonstrate our respect and thanks".

Although Adrian found the restoration hard work and very difficult at times, he said this was nothing compared to the sacrifice the officers made when they fought and died in the First World War.

#### Remembered

Dom Allen added: "I think that Adrian has done superb work and I believe that it is right and proper that the sacrifice made by these men is remembered for a long time to come."

A tired but happy Adrian concluded: "I was surprised by how little I was interrupted by my children while I was working on the project!" Rumour has it he may even consider taking on another assignment. Apparently the Rutland force's commemorative board needs some attention...

## Rosewood grows CCTV network

Following the success of its first CCTV contract with Profile Security, construction company Rosewood Homes has expanded its surveillance web to a second site.

As reported by Silhouette in our last edition (see Issue 21), Rosewood's management of Lou Lauder and Keith Burns were impressed with Profile's innovative stand-alone CCTV solution installed to monitor an isolated site at Larkhall, South Lanarkshire.

Convinced about the benefits and advantages of Remote Monitoring, the pair called on Profile again,

this time to help them with another project in Carluke. Following a detailed review of their requirements, a contract was agreed in June and equipment installed before the end of the month. This time, the site calls for a wired CCTV system which will be in place for the six-month duration of the build.

Lou's son, Project Manager **Stephen Lauder** is pleased with the results: "Our people can have access to the site 24/7 by viewing camera footage via the App. They can see what the cameras see live at any time!"

## Insight \* Insight \* Insight \* Insight

### Are the nation's boardrooms committed to security?

Profile's National Infrastructure Director, John Davies, looks into this sensitive and often emotive topic...

Historically, security has been perceived by the majority of organisations as a necessary evil, a costly overhead that has to be 'endured'. Like many other functions that form part of a business, security has also operated in a silo, constrained and isolated from the main thrust of a company's activities.



What hope, then, of seeing the protection and wellbeing of staff and visitors step out of the shadows, of seeing security as an essential enabler? With hindsight, the horrific events of 9/11 eighteen years ago turned out to be a watershed as the world was forced to come to terms with the threat of terrorism in all its unpredictable and irrational forms.

Organisations have since realised that to maintain a viable business, they must operate in a secure environment, accepting the associated costs and, sometimes, operational restrictions. There has been a shift in the way companies manage relationships, responsibilities and accountability. Often referred to as Corporate

Governance, the Board, managers and shareholders now play by different rules and procedures to provide the structure through which company objectives are set and adhered to.

Whereas Corporate Governance once focused merely on financial control, growth and profit, the Board now has a far wider remit: it needs to provide staff and shareholders with assurances that the business can operate in a secure environment.

#### Accountability, Assurance, Performance

An effective and resilient security regime must be built around these principles:

Accountability takes ownership of the security process, its delivery and performance. The Board must ensure that there is an effective risk management process in place, that all managers play their part. Many companies facilitate this process by appointing an Executive Security Committee with powers to approve strategies, policy and funding.

Assurance needs to demonstrate to shareholders and stakeholders that everything possible is being done to protect their investment and, crucially, the people involved in the business. This 'tell it as it is' transparency must be supported by auditable evidence and a robust process. It is no longer acceptable to assume that the absence of security incidents means that security must be watertight, or that no changes or improvements are required.

**Performance Management**, properly developed and delivered, must provide the Board with hard facts. This requires 'top down & bottom up trust and commitment' to ensure that security performance and effectiveness genuinely reflect the truth about perceived and actual threats.

There has been a cultural change at Board level. There is greater emphasis on security today. Companies are, at last, investing significant capital in security. For some Boardrooms this will be a long road, but for many more the responsibility for security is now simply seen as part and parcel of 'doing business'.

## MANAGING PERFORMANCE: TIME TO ACT

The way in which security is seen and supported at corporate level has been changing for the better in recent years (see *Insight*, page 4). To maintain the buy-in of senior management, security arrangements need to be assessed and reviewed. Doing so relies on effective Performance Management.

## Profile joins London's elite incident team



Profile Security is one of 18 founding members to have set up the City Security Council (CSC), a collaborative partnership between elite security companies and the City of London Police.

Members will work with the Police and the City of London Corporation whenever there is a major incident or significant threat within London's Square Mile, sharing intelligence, resources, and more than 1,000 security officers.

The CSC looks to improve collective response to threats in major urban areas and provide the highest levels of detection, prevention, deterrence and response.

The idea for a collaborative security effort stemmed from the increased incidence of terrorist attacks in 2016 and a recognition that private companies have a role to play in helping to make the capital safer. The CSC's founding follows the Home Office and Joint Security and Resilience Centre's decision to have more private policing in the future.

Profile looks forward to working collaboratively with the CSC and The City of London Police, which will enable rapid communication during fast moving incidents. The live testing exercises that CSC are looking to provide will ultimately contribute to better training and collaboration in an era of elevated threat levels.

John lived 18 miles north of Aberdeen, Jonathan 25 miles away and I lived 30 miles from the site, so it was quite a commitment until we won the BP heliport contract which we held until they closed it down 10 years later."

Greatly appreciated by his colleagues, John retired in 2006. He will be sadly missed. Profile extends its sincere condolences to his family and friends.
